Our programs were created in 1982 to allow all young children in our community and surrounding areas to have access to early childhood education and get a head start on learning!

Why is early education important?

Children who are given the advantage of attending early childhood education programs develop emotional, academic, and social skills that help them succeed in kindergarten and beyond.

Early learning centers expose children to a classroom community and a language-rich setting. Children who attend these programs are more confident, independent and better prepared for future learning experiences.

OUR FACILITY:

Our classroom is located at **707 Birtle St, Moosomin, SK S0G 3N0**

We provide walking services for children (who are also enrolled in daycare) to and from the daycare, in the event parents are not able to drop off and pick up children at the session time.



What do we offer?

At Kids Kollege and Playschool we offer children an opportunity to learn physical and social skills. The children are taught numbers, letters, songs, rhyming, guided movement, hand-eye co-ordination, public performances and much more! Our room encourages children to explore through different centers and move freely from area to area, choosing the activities in which they wish to participate. These areas include manipulative toys, house corner, blocks, art and craft area, table top puzzles and sensory tables.

The Playschool teachers encourage and interact with the children, providing them with opportunities to verbalize their needs, requests and concerns and assist in positive peer interactions. For the children, this is an excellent opportunity to learn socialization skills that are essential for kindergarten.

Our friendly teachers have post-secondary education in child development. Our priority is to ensure that your child's needs are met with encouraging self-help and pre-kindergarten skill development. The teacher strives to provide an excellent program that reflects each child's interests. Our program is constantly evolving to ensure we provide the very best we can offer.

\$85 per month or \$850 per year

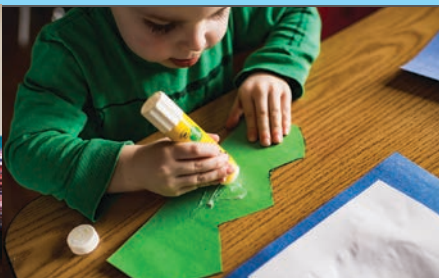

Kids Kollege — 4 Year old

Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday

8:45am - 12:00pm September to June

\$100 per month or \$1000 per year



Some benefits of attending Playschool include: Access to a speech pathologist screening, learning social skills, learning how to follow a routine, being introduced to a classroom setting, learning how to take turns, learning to share and be respectful to others, and learning to work and play cooperatively. We also provide student portraits and class photo and interaction with parents using app Class Dojo.

Kids Kollege provides: Access to a speech pathologist, excursions such as visits to the library, fire hall, senior's home, Conexus Credit Union, post office and a visit to the Kindergarten classroom. Kids Kollege offers endless learning experiences to the children to prepare them for Kindergarten. We also provide student portraits and class photo, student progress reports (in the middle of the year and at the end), interaction with parents using app Class Dojo.
